Vibrating equipment supplier Joest has bagged a string of successful orders in Africa. "We have supplied six vibrating screens to a gold mine in Liberia, eight vibrating screens to a gold mine in Mali and 15 vibrating screens to a gold mine in Burkina Faso," Yashin Ramdhin, general manager of sales at Joest said.

"We have also supplied screens to Tanzania and have had vibratory feeders go into a coal mine in Mozambique. We are optimistic that our growth in Africa will go from strength to strength."

Joest is looking in particular to penetrate the sub-Saharan market in addition to various parts of West Africa. "This is accomplished by working in tandem with the mining houses and engineering companies who are active in the African market," Ramdhin explained.

All products are shipped from Joest's Spartan, Johannesburg facility. "A lot of companies are finding it easier to procure products directly from South Africa rather than importing them into Africa or attempting local manufacture. After validation testing, we ship our products fully assembled so all the customer needs to do is simply install it," adds Ramdhin.
